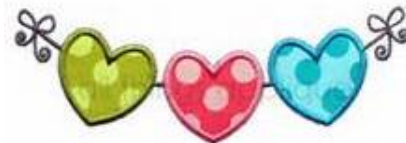

At the end of the meeting, parents will make an appointment to have their child assessed in May. KEEP US CURRENT

Please be sure to take the time to check over your Skyward Family Access account to make sure that all household and emergency contacts have been added. We have found many accounts that only have one parent listed and no additional emergency contacts. Visitors must be on the student’s emergency contact list in order to pick up the student. If they are not, the office must receive an email, note, or call from the student’s guardian giving permission for that person to do so.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

*Students will go outside for recess when the wind chill is above ten degrees.



Please insist that your students bring coats, hats, and gloves.

*Listen every morning to local radio or television stations to learn of any delays or cancellations.

*Do not call the school for information regarding delays or cancellations. The radio and television stations are very reliable and we want to keep our phone lines open for emergency needs.

*Students who must remain inside for health reasons must have a note from their parent or guardian. A note is required each day. After three days, a note from the doctor is required.



Usually, if a child is too sick to go outside for recess, he/she is too sick to be in school.

*If school is not open due to weather, the Boys and Girls club will also not be open that day. However, when the weather becomes bad during the school day, the Boys and Girls Club will remain open until all children are picked up and home safely.



INFLUENZA INFORMATION



If your child has flu symptoms (fever of 100, headache, fatigue, cough, muscle aches, sore throat, runny or stuff nose), it is

recommended you notify your medical provider. Certain medications may help shorten the time your child is sick and may reduce complications.

Please remember our policy regarding fevers: If your child has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, keep him/her home until fever-free for 24 hours (without pain/fever-reducing medicine). Children with a temperature of 100 or above cannot stay in school and parents will be notified to pick them up.
