

ACADEMIC TEAMS BEGIN QUEST FOR STATE TITLE

On Monday, March 6, the NorthWood High School Academic Teams traveled to Warsaw High School to compete against thirteen other schools for the first Invitational Super Bowl of the year. NorthWood High School finished first over-all. The Science Team, coached by Miss Stephani Neff, finished first. The Fine Arts Team and Social Studies Team, coached by Mrs. Melinda Sharp and Mrs. Natalie Kranenburg, both placed second. The English, Interdisciplinary, and Math teams placed high enough to catapult the NorthWood team to the over-all winner of the competition.

The theme for this year's competition is the French Revolution. Mrs. Vorhis (English), Mrs. Sharp (Fine Arts), Mrs. Kranenburg (Social Studies), Mr. Gerber (Math), and Miss Neff (Science and Interdisciplinary) have been busy guiding their students in the study of this subject since October.



The Academic Teams were back in action on Thursday, March 23, at Wawasee High School where they successfully defended their NLC Conference Title. NorthWood High School has won 23 of 25 NLC Competitions.

MATHEMATICS RESULTS

Forty-eight NorthWood High School math students participated in the 67th annual American Mathematics Contest 12 and/or the 17th annual American Mathematics Contest 10, a 25-question, 75-minute test on Tuesday, February 7. Twenty-three seniors and juniors took the AMC 12 and twenty-five sophomores and freshmen took the AMC 10, competing for local, regional, and national student and school awards. In 2017, over 250,000 students from more than 4200 schools participated nationally in the AMC 10 and AMC 12 contests. Top scorers at NorthWood on this year's AMC 12 were junior Arron Smith (82.5), along with senior Cameron Stillson (70.5) and junior Cameron Hershberger (60). Top scorers on the AMC 10 were sophomores Dawson Bley (79.5), Mae Metzger (75), Reegan Miller (70.5), and freshman Tiana Yoder (69). A score of 96 or more qualified AMC 12 participants for

the second-level exam (AIME). AMC 10 participants needed a score of 112.5 to advance. Some U.S. universities and colleges ask for AMC scores on their application forms. Congratulations to all students on a solid showing on a very difficult test.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY INDUCTS NEW MEMBERS

On Monday, March 20, forty-four juniors were inducted into the National Honor Society (NHS) at a dinner at Dal-Mar Catering. Last year's twenty-eight inductees hosted the program for the evening, along with NHS sponsors and administrators. Total NHS membership for the 2016-17 school year consists of seventy-two members.

The Honor Society is composed of members of the junior and senior class. Selection to the NHS is conducted at the beginning of the second trimester each year by the faculty and is based upon scholarship, service, character, and leadership. The endeavors of these students will be recognized during the induction ceremony. Congratulations are extended to all of the members on their accomplishments AND to their parents for their efforts in raising such fine, young individuals!

PROM 2017

The 2017 Prom Club has been diligently planning this year's prom. This formal event for NorthWood juniors, seniors, and their guests is scheduled for Friday, May 12, from 8:00 p.m. until 12:00 a.m. at the Palais Royale located at 105 West Colfax Avenue, South Bend. Tickets will be on sale at school beginning April 24 for \$35 per person. Dinner is not included. Juniors who sold their magazine quota will receive one free, non-transferable prom ticket. Information regarding dress code and other important matters have been posted in school and on the school's website.

SCHOLASTIC ART COMPETITION

Scholastic Regional is the largest and most prestigious competition that covers eighteen (18) counties in NW Indiana/SW Michigan in which our students participate. This year we are pleased to announce that five (5) of NWHS student works were selected out of over 3,200 submissions. We have three gold keys, a silver key, and an honorable mention.

The Gold key winners are Mae Metzger (sophomore) and Whitney Wolfe (sophomore) in Drawing, and Jenna Poulson (senior) in Printmaking. The silver key winner is Jenny Ha (freshman) in Mixed Media. Esteban Perez (junior) is Honorable Mention in Drawing.

NEWS FROM THE NURSE

Notice to next year's seniors:

The state of Indiana requires all students in 6th through 12th grades to have the appropriate number of Meningococcal Conjugate vaccine doses. One dose is required for all students in 6th through 11th grades. A second booster dose is *required* for students entering 12th grade. It is now *recommended* a complete series of Meningococcal Serogroup B vaccine also be completed. These vaccines are a legal requirement for school entry (Indiana Administrative Code 410 IAC 1-1) into 12th grade. Documentation showing the required vaccine was given must be returned to NorthWood High School before your student begins their senior year. You may contact your healthcare provider or the Elkhart County Health Department (523-2127) to receive the required vaccine.

Due to ISTEP testing at NorthWood High School on Tuesday, April 18, Thursday, April 20, and Friday, April 21, the high school will operate on a 2 hour+ delay schedule for juniors and seniors. Classes will begin at 10:00 on Tuesday and 10:15 on Thursday and Friday. Busses will run at a normal time for underclassmen.

FRESHMEN that have taken Biology

- Tuesday, April 18 only will test in Science.
- Thursday and Friday
 - Students riding busses will report to the south side of the cafeteria
- Classes will start at 10:00 on Tuesday and 10:15 on Thursday and Friday.

SOPHOMORES

 Will test in English or Math each day. If a student is absent on a test day, they will make up their test the following week.

JUNIORS, SENIORS and non-biology freshmen
