Miss Crilow Mrs. Beehler Mr. Mattern At Wakarusa Elementary students are expected to follow the Life-Long Guide-Lines and Life skills. These will be explained and practiced throughout the school year. We appreciate your support and welcome you as a very important part of our team.

LANGUAGE ARTS

A combination of a basal reader and trade books are used in Reading. Reading skills and comprehension are worked with to meet the needs of the student. Students also read a variety of books for accelerated reader. The students are asked to read a minimum of 13 points per each 12 week grading period. Language Arts includes Reading, Language, Writing, and Spelling.

MATH

Mastery of basic facts is expected, especially multiplication. Basic fact drill using computers is implemented. Problem solving strategies are practiced. Saxon math books are used for the incremental development of math skills. Students are ability grouped.

WRITING

Writing mechanics are taught. Cursive writing is practiced. Process writing skills are taught and used in the 4th grade.



INDIANA HISTORY

Indiana History is taught using textbooks, supplementary materials, and class discussion. This is the only year in which Indiana history is formally taught. Students are encouraged to memorize the Indiana state poem.



HOMEWORK

Homework is given in 4th grade. Students will have an Assignment book to help with responsibility and communication between home and school. Assignments are written on the board each day. Thirty minutes of homework should be the average per night. Responsibility is the key word for 4th graders.
