As we turn the calendar to the month of March next week, we are entering our third and final trimester of the school year! We hope you've had a chance to review your child's report card, which is accessible through Skyward. If you haven't yet, please take some time to look it over and celebrate your child's progress. We are also approaching the state's testing windows for IREAD and ILEARN. Next week, we will be administering the IREAD assessment to our 2nd and 3rd grade students. Third graders will take the test on Tuesday, March 4, and Wednesday, March 5, while 2nd graders will take the assessment on Thursday, March 6, and Friday, March 7. Families of these students should have received an email last week with important IREAD information and state requirements—if you did not receive that email, please contact the school office. For our students in grades 3-5, ILEARN testing will take place between April 14 and May 9, with our plan to begin testing on Monday, April 21. A more detailed schedule for ILEARN will be shared in the March newsletter.

We hope to see many of our families at the "Raise Your Paws" auction on Saturday, March 29! This exciting event is a wonderful opportunity to support our school community, and more details will be sent home in the coming weeks. Spring Pictures: Spring pictures will take place on Thursday, March 6. Every student will have their picture taken unless you send in a note or email asking them to be exempt from picture day. Parents can pay directly on Lifetouch's website by using Picture ID: EVTDWJBKW or fill out an order form and send in payment before picture day. Checks should be made payable to Lifetouch. Order forms were sent home with students this week. A few weeks after picture day, Lifetouch will send home picture proof sheets and order forms to those that did not pre-order pictures. This will give you another opportunity to order spring pictures if you did not order them before picture day. Ordering spring pictures is completely optional, but our school does receive a percentage of all sales which goes into our Student Activities account. These funds are used to help pay for incentives and other programs / activities for our students.

<u>Kindergarten Round-Up:</u> Kindergarten registration for Wa-Nee elementary students will begin on Monday, March 3. Parents must visit the <u>Wa-Nee website</u> and complete an online registration form. That information will be distributed to the school your child should attend based on your home address. The school will send families an email confirmation with details on how to complete the enrollment process. Families with no internet access can contact the school to register by phone.

Kindergarten Round-Up will be on Thursday, March 13. Two sessions will be available for parents to choose from. The first session will begin at 9:30 a.m. and the 2nd session will begin at 5:30 p.m. Students are <u>not</u> expected to attend this event as this will be an informational meeting for parents to hear about Kindergarten expectations and ask questions. Parents can also complete the enrollment process if they have not done so beforehand. Once the enrollment process has been completed, families can schedule their child's Kindergarten assessment. **We recommend doing this as soon as possible as dates / times for assessments are limited.** Teachers will be administering the assessment for our incoming kindergarten students in the spring. These assessments will be administered in a 1-on-1 setting.

The following items will be necessary for completing your child's enrollment process. These items can be emailed or dropped off at the school:

- *Legal birth certificate from the County Health Department (hospital birth certificates are not permitted)
- *Immunization (shot) records
- *Proof of residency (a current bill with your name and address on it)

*The kindergarten physical form and immunizations must be completed and turned in to the school by Thursday, August 14th, 2025. Children not in compliance will not be permitted to start school.

Please pass along this information to others who do not have children currently attending NES but are planning to start Kindergarten this fall.

CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENTS: 2025-2026

HOW ARE NEXT YEAR'S CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENTS FORMED?

In the Spring, teachers meet with the Principal to create classroom assignments. In making classroom assignments, factors such as achievement, social adjustments, maturity, and boy-girl ratio are considered before decisions are made. Teacher recommendations from the previous year, social issues, academic abilities, and the number of pupils in a given class are also taken into account when making class lists.

CAN I REQUEST A TEACHER FOR MY SON OR DAUGHTER?

Because of our commitment to equitable instructional groups for all children, parent requests for a specific teacher are discouraged and can never be guaranteed. However, we realize that at times there may be <u>valid educational reasons for such requests</u>. With this in mind, requests must be made using the official Wa-Nee Community School Corporation Request for Classroom Assignment Form. The form must be picked up from the school office and must be submitted to the school office on or before <u>April 4, 2025.</u> The educational rationale for this request must be listed on the form. Because teachers have a responsibility to create equitable classes, parent requests cannot always be kept confidential.

CAN I CHANGE CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENTS AFTER THE SCHOOL YEAR HAS BEGUN?

No. Once students have begun the school year in a particular class they need to complete the year in that class. Only under rare and abnormal circumstances would such a request be considered.

CAN I HAVE MY CHILD BRING HOME A "REQUEST FOR CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENT" FORM?

No. These request forms will be kept in the school office and may only be obtained by a parent upon request. Requests written on a sheet of paper, card, faxed, or emailed will not be accepted. They must be returned by the due date without exception.
