Dear Parents:

Our students and staff have been working very hard as we push forward through the month of January. Soon, we will be celebrating the 100th day of school and are looking forward to finishing this school year

State Assessments: We are quickly approaching the beginning of the state assessments. Students in 3rd grade will take the IREAD assessment the week of March 4-8. This test will be administered over two days. A more detailed schedule will be sent home in our February newsletter. Like last year, our 2nd graders will have an opportunity to take the IREAD-3 assessment to give us readiness data we can use to best prepare them for next year. The 2nd grade classes will take the IREAD assessment the week of March 11-15. The ILEARN assessment window for grades 3-5 will be open from April 15-May 10. This schedule will be sent to families at the end of March so that you can plan ahead for those testing dates. Students in our upper grades have been working hard to learn grade level standards so they can be fully prepared for the upcoming assessments.

Scheduled E-Learning Day (Monday, April 8): Indiana will experience a total solar eclipse on Monday, April 8. The timing of the event (3:00-3:20 p.m.) creates a number of safety concerns for our students since many of our schools would in the middle of dismissal while others will already be on the bus. For the safety of our students, the school board has passed a motion to make that day a scheduled E-Learning Day. Students will attend E-Learning on April 8 and will return to in-session classes on Tuesday, April 9.

School Nurse News



<u>Nurse Nuggets:</u> It's the time of year to expect cold and flu symptoms in addition to other viruses. Some of these are unavoidable, but there are several things you can do at home to help prevent illness and keep everyone feeling healthy. Here are some tips to remember:

- WASH, WASH, WASH YOUR HANDS! This is still the best defense against illness. Encourage your children to wash, especially before meals, using soap and warm water. To ensure they are taking enough time to adequately kill germs, have them sing the ABC song while scrubbing.
- Get plenty of rest. School age children should get 9-11 hours of sleep each night.
- Drink lots of fluids and eat a balanced diet. Don't skip breakfast!
- Dress appropriately for cold weather. Please help your child choose warm, comfortable clothing for school each day. Make sure they are wearing a coat, hat, and gloves. Please contact us if you need clothing assistance.

Please call or email me at irshields@wanee.org if you have any questions or would like to discuss your child's illness. It is important to keep your child home until they have been fever free for 24 hours without fever reducers and vomit/diarrhea free for 24 hours. If you have a change in address or phone number, remember to update that in Skyward or contact the school office. It is very important to be able to reach you in the event your child becomes ill at school. Have a safe and HEALTHY winter!

<u>Kindergarten Round-Up:</u> Kindergarten registration for Wa-Nee elementary students will begin on Friday, March 1. Parents must visit the <u>Wa-Nee website</u> and complete an online registration form. That information will be distributed to the school your child should attend based on your home address. The school will send families an email confirmation with details on how to complete the enrollment process. Families with no internet access can contact the school to register by phone.

Kindergarten Round-Up will be on Thursday, March 14. Two sessions will be available for parents to choose from. The first session will begin at 9:30 a.m. and the 2nd session will begin at 5:30 p.m. Students are not expected to attend this event as this will be an informational meeting for parents to hear about Kindergarten expectations and ask questions. Parents can also complete the enrollment process if they have not done so beforehand. Once the enrollment process has been completed, families can schedule their child's Kindergarten assessment. **We recommend doing this as soon as possible as dates** / times for assessments are limited. Teachers will be administering the assessment for our incoming kindergarten students in the spring. These assessments will be administered in a 1-on-1 setting.

The following items will be necessary for completing your child's enrollment process. These items can be emailed or dropped off at the school:

- *Legal birth certificate from the County Health Department (hospital birth certificates are not permitted)
- *Immunization (shot) records
- *Proof of residency (a current bill with your name and address on it)

*The kindergarten physical form and immunizations must be completed and turned in to the school by Thursday, August 15th, 2024. Children not in compliance will not be permitted to start school.

Please pass along this information to others who do not have children currently attending NES but are planning to start Kindergarten this fall.
