# **Nappanee Elementary News & Notes**

**Spring Pictures:** Lifetouch sent home picture proof sheets and order forms to those that did not pre-order pictures. This will give you another opportunity to order spring pictures if you did not order them before picture day. Our school receives a percentage of all sales which goes into our Student Activities account. These funds are used to help pay for incentives and other programs / activities for our students.

<u>Kindergarten Round-Up:</u> Even though Kindergarten Round-Up has passed, it is not too late to sign your child up for kindergarten. Parents must visit the <u>Wa-Nee website</u> and complete an online registration form. That information will be distributed to the school your child should attend based on your home address. The school will send families an email confirmation with details on how to complete the enrollment process. Families with no internet access can contact the school to register by phone. If you are in the process of enrolling your child for Kindergarten, please be sure to turn your paperwork in as soon as possible so that we can schedule your child's kindergarten assessment.

<u>ILEARN Testing (April 15 - May 10):</u> ILEARN testing will take place the weeks of April 15 - May 10. Please take note of the attached schedule for specific testing dates. We appreciate your support in scheduling student appointments and other activities around this testing schedule.

### How to prepare for ILEARN Testing:

- Studies show students perform better on tests when they have a good night's sleep. Help students establish a consistent evening routine and bedtime to give their brain plenty of time to rest from a busy day at school.
- We also encourage students to start their day with a nutritious breakfast. This is something we will remind students during our testing window. If they have not been regularly attending breakfast, they can still plan to join us for breakfast on those testing days, if they choose. We appreciate your assistance in giving our students the tools needed to help them put forth their very best effort.

Yearbooks for Sale: If you missed ordering a yearbook from our pre-sale, we did order a few extra. We have order envelopes in the office or you can send it in a plain envelope with "yearbook" marked on the front. The cost is \$13. Checks can be made payable to NES or you can send in cash. We have a very limited supply of extra yearbooks, so please send in your order as soon as possible. We also have yearbooks from prior years available for purchase for \$8 each. <u>Transportation Information for 2024-2025</u>: Bus routes for next school year will be finalized long before your child comes back to school in August. Therefore, plan to submit your transportation request by the end of this school year. The final deadline to request transportation for the 2024-25 school year is July 1, 2024. Any change or request submitted after July 1 may not be accepted for the beginning of the school year. For safety and emergency purposes, K-5 students must maintain a consistent transportation schedule. You are allowed one location for the morning and one location for the afternoon - all five days of the week. You may submit your consistent schedule by filling out a <u>Transportation Request Form</u>.



Blue Pinwheels: April is Child Abuse Prevention month. Did you know in 2021 there were four child abuse and neglect fatalities in Elkhart County alone, and 60 total child abuse and neglect fatalities in the state of Indiana? In April, we will have pinwheels in front of Nappanee Elementary. Pinwheels are the national symbol for child abuse prevention. They symbolize a happy, healthy childhood. At Nappanee Elementary, our goal is to raise awareness and empower people to play a role in making great childhoods happen by impacting positive change.

School Nurse News Nurse Nuggets: Does your child get enough sleep? Getting the appropriate amount of sleep each night is crucial for everyone, regardless of age. However, this is especially true for elementary school students. Sleep is directly associated with your child's health, well-being, and their ability to learn. March is National Sleep Awareness Month, which gives us the perfect opportunity to go over some ways to improve the quality and quantity of our sleep.

- School aged children should strive for 9-11 hours of sleep each night.
- Negative effects of too little sleep include:
  - Mental health outlook, mood, attention span, depression, and performance.
  - Physical health weight gain, reduced immunity, and high blood pressure.
- Tips on getting enough sleep (quantity):
  - Go to bed at the same time each night to help set your body's sleep-wake cycle.
  - Pre-sleep routines can include reading, meditation, journaling, or warm baths.
  - Avoid electronics 1 hour before bedtime.
  - Exercising regularly increases our drive to sleep, reduces stress, and improves our moods.
- Tips on quality sleep:
  - Avoid caffeine and spicy or fried foods right before bed,
  - Keep your room dark, cool, and comfortable.
  - Consider using a sound machine to block out other noises.

# **CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENTS: 2024-2025**

### HOW ARE NEXT YEAR'S CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENTS FORMED?

In the Spring, teachers meet with the Principal to create classroom assignments. In making classroom assignments, factors such as achievement, social adjustments, maturity, and boy-girl ratio are considered before decisions are made. Teacher recommendations from the previous year, social issues, academic abilities, and the number of pupils in a given class are also taken into account when making class lists.

# CAN I REQUEST A TEACHER FOR MY SON OR DAUGHTER?

Because of our commitment to equitable instructional groups for all children, parent requests for a specific teacher are discouraged and can never be guaranteed. However, we realize that at times there may be valid educational reasons for such requests. With this in mind, requests must be made using the official Wa-Nee Community School Corporation Request for Classroom Assignment Form. The form must be picked up from the school office and must be submitted to the school office on or before April 12, 2023 The educational rationale for this request must be listed on the form. Because teachers have a responsibility to create equitable classes, parent requests cannot always be kept confidential.

### CAN I CHANGE CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENTS AFTER THE SCHOOL YEAR HAS BEGUN?

No. Once students have begun the school year in a particular class they need to complete the year in that class. Only under rare and abnormal circumstances would such a request be considered.

### CAN I HAVE MY CHILD BRING HOME A "REQUEST FOR CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENT" FORM?

No. These request forms will be kept in the school office and may only be obtained by a parent upon request. Requests written on a sheet of paper, card, faxed, or emailed will not be accepted. They must be returned by the due date without exception.
