Student Devices Coming Home: As we approach the winter months, we need to make sure we are fully prepared for school cancellations and potential E-Learning days. Nurse Nuggets: It's never too soon to start teaching your children good eating habits. Kids need good nutrition to thrive physically and mentally. Here are some things to consider at home:

- 1. Encourage a healthy breakfast to start your child/children's day off right. This can lead to having a more positive, evenkeeled mood.
- Make water a priority in your child/children's diet. Adequate hydration indicates alertness and other cognitive abilities are positively affected, which makes it easier to learn.
- Choose snacks that are high in protein and fiber. Increased intake of protein and fiber helps stabilize blood-sugars, which boosts energy and moods.
- Avoid excess sugar and artificial dyes. Research shows that these are known factors that affect our moods in a negative way, making it harder to focus and thrive in school.
