Book Fair: The Scholastic Book Fair is today - October 5. The Book Fair is open from 12:30-3:30 today and 9:00-3:30 Monday through Thursday. Our Book Fair Family Night will be during the Bulldog Open House on Thursday, October 5 from 5:00-6:30 p.m. Come visit our photo booth to get a fun selfie with your child. Make sure to look at your child's wish list that they will complete in library class. There will also be teacher wish lists available if you would like to help your child's classroom library. You can visit our <u>Book Fair website</u> to see a sample of the books that will be available or download the Book Fair app to see the eWallet option. We are required to collect 7% sales tax by the state of Indiana so please be sure to send in extra money to cover that additional fee. <u>Picture Retakes</u>: School pictures were sent home a few weeks ago. If you would like your child's picture retaken, please return the entire picture packet to the school by Thursday, October 12. If your child did not have pictures taken on picture day or you missed placing an order, you may order them online at <u>Lifetouch</u> using **Picture ID: EVTCQZTB6** or turn in an order form by October 12 with your payment. Order forms are available in the school office.

<u>Red Ribbon Week Poster Contest:</u> Students in Grades 1-5 are encouraged to design and decorate a poster for Red Ribbon Week using their own creative thoughts and ideas. This year's theme is "Stay in the Game - Play Drug Free!" Students should use that theme or one of our daily themes to create their poster. The top posters will be on display in the school during Red Ribbon Week and at NWHS around prom and graduation time. Staff members vote on the posters that best represent our theme and one student in each grade level will receive \$5 cash. Posters are due on Wednesday, October 11. Please see the Red Ribbon Week attachment for our daily themes and a full schedule of events, including our spiritwear days.

Fall Break: Classes will not be in session on Friday, October 20 & Monday, October 23 due to Fall Break.

<u>Colder Temperatures</u>: As temperatures turn colder, it becomes increasingly important to make sure students are prepared for outdoor recess and for bus stop weather. Students who walk, ride bikes, or are dropped off at school will be expected to stand in line outside the building until the bell rings at 8:30 a.m. Recesses will also be outside unless temperatures (or wind-chills) reach 10 degrees. We appreciate your help in ensuring students are properly dressed for the weather.

Pajama Day: In an effort to collect donations for Feed My Starving Children, 5th Grade is sponsoring Pajama Day on Friday, October 27. A meal for a starving child is just \$.22, so they are asking students to pay \$.25 or more to wear pajama bottoms and /or slippers and bring a blanket or stuffed animal (as long as it fits in their school bag). Fifth graders are planning to deliver the money raised and pack meals for Feed My Starving Children in November.

Parent / Teacher Conferences: Parent / Teacher Conferences will take place after school on Tuesday, November 14, and Thursday, November 16, from 3:30 - 7 p.m. Classroom teachers will be in contact with you in the weeks ahead to begin scheduling conference times. There will also be an opportunity to sign up during the Bulldog Open House on October 5.

NURSE NUGGETS:

School Nurse News

Now that we have been back in school for 6 weeks here are a few things to keep in mind:

- Immunizations: If your child is still in need of their immunizations, please contact their PCP or the Elkhart County Health Department at 574-523-2127 to make an appt. Dr. Croner has extended the exclusion date to 10/13/23.
- Vision Screens: Every year the 1st, 3rd, and 5th graders will have acuity vision screens done by the school nurse. The 1st graders also have MCT screens (Modified Clinical Technique) done by local eye care professionals. If your child requires additional eye care, you will receive a note from the school nurse before Fall Break.
- Head Lice: It is very important that you screen your child/children for head lice regularly. If you find live lice and/or nits, please treat your child with appropriate lice treatment and let the school nurse know.
- Allergies: Fall, although pretty, is a season that can cause allergies and/or asthma flareups. If applicable, please remember to give your child their allergy medication regularly and if they are asthmatic, please inform the school nurse and be sure they have an inhaler at school. If your child needs cough medicine, be sure to contact the school nurse and please send the preferred OTC cough medicine to school. Please be sure to let the nurse know when their last dose was or when their next dose is due.

Mobile Hotspots: Just a reminder that we will not have hotspots available this year. The hotspots and the monthly service fees were paid by federal grants that expired at the conclusion of the 2022-23 school year. For households with no internet access availability or connection speeds under 25 Mbps, WCS encourages you to register at the following website (select household from the applicant type dropdown menu): https://indianaegms.force.com/nlc/s/login/SelfRegister?locale=us. More information on the Indiana Connectivity Program can be found here: https://www.in.gov/ocra/broadband/icp/. Households with internet access availability over 25 Mbps that is cost prohibitive, may qualify for the new Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). Households may apply by contacting their preferred internet service provider to learn more about the application or by visiting https://www.acpbenefit.org/.
