- ⇒ At our Junior assembly last week, students were introduced to [BigFuture scholarships](#) available through the College Board. This is a series of useful tasks students complete through the College Board that earns them entries into monthly scholarship drawings. Completing all six steps will make them eligible to win a \$40,000 scholarship. Right now, juniors can be building their college list on BigFuture and completing free, personalized SAT prep through Khan Academy.
