We appreciate your patience and understanding as we plan for the safe reopening of your schools. The Elkhart County public school superintendents have been meeting weekly with Elkhart County Health Department, the Elkhart County Commissioners and the mayors of Elkhart, Goshen, and Nappanee as we prepare for the 2020-2021 school year. The Indiana Department of Education recently released guidance on the reopening of schools in their IN-CLASS report. All Elkhart County public schools will be starting on their scheduled date offering instructional options to attend school both in person or through remote learning. Reopening plans will include procedures for:



- Self-screening
- Cleaning and disinfecting
- Facial coverings and shields
- Bus transportation
- Social distancing
- Identifying, tracing, and reporting cases of COVID-19
