SPORTS PHYSICALS

New sports physical forms are available in the main office window. Physicals for 2025-2026 must be dated on or after April 1st, 2025. We will not accept physicals that were performed before this date for the upcoming school year.

ALL athletes must upload physical forms to Final Forms once you have completed your physical. We will not be accepting paper copies this coming school year! There will be an email sent out at the beginning of the new school year with the information on how to download Final Forms. Once you have used Final Forms, you can go in and adjust information from year to year. Final Forms also has emergency contact information for coaches. The High School also uses Final Forms for all sports.

2025-2026 Transportation Request & Change Deadlines

June 18, 2025 Transportation Plans for Next Year	Emails will go out on, or around, Wednesday, June 18 with your child's transportation plan for next year. If that information is correct, you do not need to do anything further. If any part of that information is incorrect, please click on the link in that email, which is specific to the student listed in that email, to update their transportation plan. This means that if you have multiple children, you will need to ensure that you are using the specific link for each child and not the same link for all children.
August 1, 2025 Final Day to Change Transportation Plans	Please make any corrections to your child's transportation plan as soon as you can once you receive the email in June. To be eligible for transportation on the first day of school, final changes must be submitted by August 1.

August 2 - August 13

Changes May Not Take Effect Until August 20

Transportation requests or changes submitted between August 2 - August 13 will not take effect until Wednesday, August 20, unless there is little to no impact on route times and path.

Schedule Changes During the School Year

During the school year, at least one school day's notice to the transportation department, not the school, is required for all transportation plans to take effect. For safety and security reasons, requests must be made in writing by filling out the <u>online request form</u> or requesting a paper copy from the school.

Reminders:

- 1. Students many only ride their assigned bus.
- 2. Schedules must be consistent; you must choose one AM location and one PM location.
- 3. All bus stop and bus riding safety rules must be followed to be eligible for transportation.

The 21st Century Scholarship is an opportunity for students to afford college in Indiana. The 21st Century Scholarship pays up to 100% of tuition at public colleges in Indiana and part of the tuition at private or independent colleges. The scholarship does not cover the cost of books, room and board, parking fees, lab fees or any other fees that are not assessed to all students.
