ACT/SAT FACTS

- **When should I take the ACT or SAT?** Generally, students take college entrance exams in the spring of their junior year and/or fall of their senior year. More than half of students elect to take the exam more than once to increase their scores.
- **What is the difference between the ACT and SAT?** The SAT tests general verbal and mathematical reasoning skills while the ACT is more closely tied with high school curricula.
- **Which test is more difficult?** The two tests measure different things. Whether one test seems harder will vary from student to student, but students perform similarly on both tests.
- **Which test do colleges prefer?** Equal consideration for college admission is given regardless of which test you take.
- **How are scores reported?** If the ACT is taken more than once, the student decides which score to report to the colleges they have selected. If the SAT is taken more than once, all scores are reported to the colleges the student has selected. Colleges vary on the policy of determining which scores, or combination of scores, they use in admissions decisions.
